Summary of the Role as a Corporation Member (Governor)

Collectively, individual Governors contribute their professional and general skills and knowledge to the Corporation (through its committees and subcommittees) in a non-executive role so as to:

- determine the educational character and mission of the College
- determine the core values and strategic direction of the College
- approve the quality strategy of the institution
- make effective and efficient use of the resources, and safeguarding their assets
- ensure the financial health of the College and approve the annual estimate of income and expenditure
- oversee the appointment, grading, suspension, dismissal and determination of pay and conditions of service of senior post holders
- setting the framework for the pay and conditions of service of all other staff comply with the College's Code of Conduct, which includes the Nolan Committee's seven principles of public life
 - strengthen College links with its business and local communities
 - comply with the Corporation's meeting standing orders in the conduct of Corporation business
 - serve on appropriate Corporation subcommittees
 - assist in the annual self assessment review of governance
 - attend appropriate Governor training and development events as required

A College Governor, also known as a Corporation member, is expected to prepare for and attend all meetings of the FE Corporation and relevant subcommittees. Corporation meetings usually take place three times per year on Tuesday evenings and meetings last approximately 2 hours. All governors are also expected to undertake appropriate induction and attend ongoing training sessions held twice per year.
